FROM FATHER DREW THE GREAT ADVENTURE STORY OF THE BOOK OF KINGS ...

1 Kings 21.17.29, Tuesday of the 11 th week in Ordinary Time

Have you found me out, my enemy? That is another great opening line from the corrupt King Ahab, as he sparred once again with the prophet Elijah. Earlier in the 1 st Book of Kings, heard read at daily Mass this month, King Ahab began a conversation with Elijah by asking: *Is that you, you troubler of Israel?*

Elijah was trouble indeed. He killed over 450 of Queen Jezebel's prophets after proving they were *false* prophets. One would have hoped an incident like that would have been a conversion opportunity for Ahab and his scheming wife. But it wasn't. Instead, Jezebel vowed to kill Elijah, and Ahab kept to his corrupt ways, giving himself up to doing evil and becoming a complete abomination to God.

The idolatry and paganism were one thing, but as we saw in yesterday's passage, Ahab ventured into the violation of human rights. A common man, Naboth, had a nice vineyard. And the king wanted it. He did offer to buy it, but the vineyard owner refused, telling Ahab, "I will not sell out my ancient heritage." So, Jezebel engaged in what today we call "lawfare" against Naboth, complete with scoundrel witnesses and a show trial. Naboth the vineyard owner was then sentenced to death. Ahab murdered and then took possession. That prompted Elijah to give Ahab a message from God:

*For this, the LORD says:
In the place where the dogs licked up the blood of Naboth,
the dogs shall lick up your blood, too.'*

*Because you have given yourself up to doing evil in the LORD's sight,
I am bringing evil upon you: I will destroy you.*

And here the courage of Elijah and the clarity of his message brought about a conversion of sorts in Ahab. For Ahab put on sackcloth and became subdued. He fasted. Then, humbled before the Lord, the punishment that was in order would not visit Ahab in his own lifetime. Instead, his sons would have to pay for it.

A couple hundred years before this, King David murdered and took possession of another man's wife. After David put on sackcloth and fasted the prophet Nathan told him his sin was forgiven. However, the sword would never leave David's household; the peace he made would not last. For there are consequences for sin. Whether God forgives a person's sins or not, he still has to pay for it. That is called justice. So we will all pay for sin – either in this life, or the next one. The smart play then is to humble ourselves now, and make reparation now, and give up doing evil and chasing after man-made idols.

In the meantime, understand: A descendent of King David, the Prince of Peace, brought a sword with Him. The sword was His cross, on which He shed His Blood. At Holy Mass we get on our knees and lap that Blood up; Blood produced in God's vineyard on Calvary; the Blood that gives us eternal life.
