Thoughts from Father Fenlon

Would YOU like to win a solid gold rosary?

The price of gold is sitting at about \$4000 an ounce right now. Just two months ago, it was at an all time peak of nearly \$6000 an ounce.

Venerable Fulton Sheen said of Judas that “he knew the price of everything, but the value of nothing”. That’s the danger with a solid gold rosary.

A heart that loves the world, like the heart of Judas, essentially ‘misses the point’. That heart, whether it desires fame, or power, or money, or pleasure, turns everything it touches into dust and corruption.

The most beautiful beaches on planet earth are no-go zones for anyone wanting to save their eternal soul. Why? Because the heart of man is corrupt.

The most harmonic and catchy melodies nearly always have sinister and malicious lyrics attached. Why? Because the heart of man is corrupt.

The most prosperous nation in the world is also the one with the most sins and perversions in the history of the world. Why? Because the heart of man is corrupt.

It is out of man’s heart comes forth evil intentions, that stain and tarnish whatever they touch.

And God is the exact opposite. God purifies anything that he touches – God converts, and heals, and elevates.

This is a true story, as staggering as it is to believe. A parish group went on pilgrimage, and at the shrine of their destination, they prayed the rosary. One young man looked down at the rosary in his hands as he prayed, to see that it had transformed into gold. Solid gold.

He showed his parents, and they put it aside and gave him another one to continue praying.

Within moments, it too had turned into solid gold. The group was astounded at this apparent miracle – they each started handing him their rosaries, and each rosary turned into solid gold as the young man held onto it, and remained as gold after it left his hands.

And that young man soon broke down in tears. He did not think of the profit, or the power, or to attribute anything to himself. Instead, he declared that these hands of his did not belong to this world, but to God, and resolved immediately to join the seminary, that they should become the hands of a priest.

And you who read these words must ask of yourself that question too: what does your heart desire above all else?
