Catholic Virtue for August



DILIGENCE

He did all things well.----Mark 7:37

A servant of God, at the point of death, once spoke thus: "Now I know that *totum opus nostrum in operatione consistit*----our actions are our sole concern."

St. Aloysius Gonzaga set down in writing a resolution that he would do all in his power that everyone of his actions might be good, and bring him nearer to God.

St. Bonaventure used to excite himself and others to constant occupation in good works by often repeating this beautiful sentiment: Every hour that we waste in sloth, we lose a glory equal to the good works we might have performed in it.

Thoughts from Father Fenlon

Occasionally in our humdrum lives we get these little glimpses beyond the natural world and into the supernatural one. It could be, a sign when you are praying for something. A grace, a smile from our Lord or our Lady.

But the supernatural world remains mostly invisible, hidden beyond a veil.

The veil seems to slip occasionally. But it is secure, do not doubt it. There is, however, one part of the supernatural world that is further out of reach for us, and that we barely ever hear of:

The growing seed.

We do not understand, for the most part, the tremendous effect that each and every one of our choices will have upon future generations.

This is also the reason why people feel so at liberty to sin without a care in the world: there is no harm – they think – nobody knows, or is affected by, my sins. Good intentions do not mean good results – the effects of sin are real.

Generations from now, people will feel the effects of our choices today in their bones. An example that we can all understand is our own Church: during the restoration, Fr. Schneider asked the intercession of Fr. Keily. I would say that he got the help he was looking for!

Maybe today we all find a home in this parish as one of the fruits of Fr. Keily’s efforts. He passed away in 1929 – almost 100 years ago – a full four generations back.

Nobody from his time is seeing first hand what we are living today... nobody is there to point out the correlation between one man’s fidelity and the fruits that it bore. They saw history continue as normal – the veil to eternity closed so hard it seemed rock, not fabric.

So it is with us.

If you or I drop the ball, let things go, get sucked into sin and vice... we may not see the effects immediately, maybe not even in our lifetime. But be warned: if you choose to do evil, no matter what your intention is, your family and your people will suffer the effects, probably even a hundred years down the line.

Likewise, if you rise to the challenges that our Lord permits you to face, and respond to them with a spirit of love and sacrifice, then your family and your people will flourish, even though you may not see it coming.
