



WEEK 1

What are you doing to protect the children in your life from being victims of the temptations and confusion of today's sexualized culture? Their very lives and souls are at stake. Therefore, we can't continue to hope they learn the truth about the sacredness and purpose of their body from TV and social media. Instead, we need to take intentional and appropriate steps to inform and protect our children and grandchildren. Here are a few steps you can take.

- 1. Make the decision to not shy away from conversations about sexuality with your children and grandchildren. They are going to learn about it somewhere, so wouldn't it be better for them to learn the holy and sacred purpose of sexuality from you.
- 2. Refresh your knowledge of the Catholic teachings on the goodness and purpose of human sexuality. The Catholic Catechism provides wonderful insights we can all learn from. Scan the code above.
- 3. Be intentional to have age-appropriate conversations about their bodies with the children in your life. Instead of focusing on inappropriate behavior, highlight how their bodies should be honored, revered and safeguarded. Use the analogy of how they honor and safeguard their most prized possession, such as autographed baseball or an heirloom from a favorite grandparent.

The Catholic Catechism provides wonderful insights we can all learn from.
