THE HOLY FACE

A devotion was first presented to Sr. Mary of St. Pete in Tours, France in 1843 by our Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus revealed to her a powerful devotion He wanted to be established throughout the world - The Holy Face Devotion. The purpose of this Devotion is to make reparation for the sins of the world - specificall the sins of blasphemy, irreverence, and profanation of Sundays and Holy Days. After many years and struggles, the devotion was approved by the Church thorities. The Confraternity of the Holy Face Devoti was established on October 25, 1884, and elevated to an Archconfraternity on October 1, 1885, by Pope Leo XIII





A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR FR. KEVIN DREW

Genesis: The Beginning of Everything

This week at daily Mass the Church has us read from Genesis. Professor Peter Kreeft, in *Understand the Bible* once provided good commentary on the beginning of the Bible.

Kreeft wrote that Genesis begins not just with the beginning of something, but with the beginning of everything. The Hebrew word used in the first verse of the Bible is bara. That word had no equivalent in ancient languages. It means not just to make but to create, not just to re–form something new out of something old, but to create something wholly new that was simply not there before. Only God can create, for creation in the literal sense (out of nothing) requires infinite power, since there is an infinite gap between nothing and something.

Only the Hebrews had a creation story. Their God was radically different than the gods of paganism. To have infinite power their God had to be one. He could not be limited by others. He had to have infinite wisdom to go with His infinite power. As Kreeft wrote, the wisest people on earth cannot make lasting peace or a perfect society, much less a universe. Creation also requires a fantastic sense of beauty (*Poems are made by fools like me, but only God can make a tree*). And it also involves an infinite amount of generosity. For God is infinitely generous. Afterall, how can anyone, like ourselves, who did not exist at one point, deserve to be created?

Kreeft wrote that without the notion of creation, nature is either denied or it is worshipped. Ancient pagans in the east saw nature as an illusion. In the West the pagans saw creation as something sacred. So, they worshipped it. They worshipped trees and the sun and mother earth, just as the neo-pagans do today. We however, believe in creation. That means we worship the Creator. We do so because creation frees nature from nothingness and frees it from becoming God.

In the beginning, when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless wasteland, and darkness covered the abyss, while a mighty wind swept over the waters.

Then God said.

"Let there be light," and there was light.

St. John wrote, the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness does not overcome it. John saw the light and testified to it. And so do we. We testify to Christ, who is the light of the world. We then do not worship trees or the sun or any other created thing. We worship the One who created the trees. And at Holy Mass we worship the One who hangs on the tree. We worship Him who is light from light, and true God from true God. We worship Him who by His death and resurrection creates a new heaven and a new earth, saving us from the darkness of hell.

To get the conversation started, ask them what they imagine their future spouse and their wedding will be like?

For older children, this is a prime opportunity to read with them about the Sacrament of Matrimony in the Catholic Catechism. The Catechism is rich in laying out the purpose and beauty of marriage and the threats to marriage. Too much is at stake to leave such an important wonder of life to today's pop culture.
