The purpose of this Devotion is to make reparation for the sins of the world - specificall the sins of blasphemy, irreverence, and profanation of Sundays and Holy Days. After many years and struggles, the devotion was approved by the Church thorities. The Confraternity of the Holy Face Devot was established on October 25, 1884, and elevated to an Archconfraternity on October 1, 1885, by Pope Leo XIII



A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR FR. KEVIN DREW Art is the Signature of Man.

Below is more commentary on Genesis (1:20 - 2:4) which we are reading through at daily Mass this month.

Then God said, "Let the earth bring forth all kinds of living creatures: cattle, creeping things, and wild animals of all kinds." and so it happened ... Such is the story of the heavens and the earth at heir creation.

Is that true? Is God the artist? Did God create animals and then create man in His own image? Or is this just a fairy tale written by some imaginative Hebrews centuries before Christ was born?

It can be argued that the book of Genesis is an artistic answer to an ultimate question. Speaking of art: In 1925 GK Chesterton wrote in *The* Everlasting Man how modern-scholars get very imaginative when studying the "cave man's" drawing of deer on the wall. From the drawing scholars deduce that the cave man grunted, walked around naked, and beat his wife over the head with a club. But Chesterton wrote that strictly speaking we know nothing about prehistoric man for the simple reason that he was exactly that - prehistoric.

Chesterton wrote that all the picture on the wall really demonstrates is that man could draw – and a deer could not. Is that just a matter of the slow development we moderns call evolution? Did monkeys begin drawing crude pictures and then men finished them? No. Monkeys and all other animals did and do not draw clumsily because they do not draw at all. Chesterton wrote it is true to say a primitive man drew a picture of a monkey, but it sounds like a joke to say the most intelligent monkey drew a picture of a man. There is a difference here, not just in degree, but in kind. Something of division and disproportion has appeared; and it is unique. Art is the signature of man.

Yes, man stands alone because as a creature he is truly different from all other creatures, for he is a creator as well as a creature.

All we can say of this notion of reproducing things in shadow or representative shape is that it exists nowhere in nature except in man. In other words, every sane sort of history must begin with man as man, a thing standing absolute and alone. How he came there, or indeed how anything else came there, is a thing for theologians and philosophers and scientists and not for historians.

The simplest truth about man, Chesterton wrote, is that he is a very strange being; almost in the sense of being a stranger on earth. He is more like an alien bringing alien habits from another land than a mere growth from this one. He doesn't sleep in his own skin: he cannot trust his own instincts. He is at the same time a creator and a cripple. He is wrapped in artificial bandages called clothes and is propped on artificial crutches called furniture. Alone among the animals he is shaken with the beautiful madness called laughter.

And so it happened. God is the artist, and He made man, who stands absolute and alone in His image. That is why art is the signature of man.
