

MASS INTENTIONS



A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR FR. KEVIN DREW

Go down at once to your people whom you brought out of the land of Egypt, for they have become depraved.

Exodus 32:7-14

The depraved Jews had made a molten calf and worshipped it. A molten object is one with a high melting point, such as found in gold. Exodus reveals how the Jews dispossessed their Egyptian neighbors of their gold before they made their escape out of Egypt. After all the plagues, culminating with the Angel of Death striking down Egyptian first-borns, the Egyptians were ready to give the Jews anything they wanted – as long they left town.

In ancient Egypt the bull or bull-calf, due to its strength, was a symbol of divinity. And so, with Moses delayed up on the mountain, the Jews lost focus. They took their eves off the mountain which created a theological vacuum. For when people turn away from God and His commandments, they turn to something else. As the psalm states: *They exchanged their glory for the image of a grass-eating bullock.* What a horrible exchange.

And so, the Lord told Moses: I'll kill everyone of those stiff-necked people.

There was more to the crime than just crafting a golden cow. A feast of some sort took place in the camp. And since the animal-worshipping pagan religions featured sexual immorality and human sacrifice, the Israelites apparently had fallen into grave sin. This was a radical change in direction from the path God marked out for them. And they broke the Covenant before the ink was even dry on the stone tablets.

Covenant. Sin. Mercy. The doctrinal basis of salvation history is found in the dialogue between Moses and God. The Israelites were freed from slavery and death, but then they turned their backs on the One who freed them. As far as God was concerned, things were then over between Him and His people. He didn't even call them "His" people at this point. He told Moses: Go down at once to your people.

Can you see Christ in Moses? That is, after all, the whole point of the high drama in Exodus. The people had turned away and deserved death. And Aaron the high priest, with his golden calf, was not the solution. Aaron represented man and false sacrifice. It would take a God-Man to atone for this offense against God. And so, in the fullness of time the Father said to His Son: Go down to your people whom you brought out of the land of Egypt.

The new Moses mediates with the Father on the mountain of Calvary. Seeing the blood written on His Son's flesh pour out of Him, a bloodletting made present at the Sacrifice of Mass, the Father remembers His promise.

The Father's blazing wrath now cooled, He relents of the punishment He threatened to inflict on His people. In exchange for fidelity, He vows to make their descendants as numerous as the stars, and gives them a land as their perpetual heritage. A horrible exchange is replaced with a wonderful exchange.

Rule over me, and transform my soul into the likeness of Thyself, so that it may bless and glorify Thee forever in the
