

Drop, drop, slow tears, And bathe those beauteous feet Which brought from heaven The news and Prince of Peace.

The feet in question from the17th century hymn Drop, Drop Slow Tears are Christ's. In the 7<sup>th</sup> chapter of Luke, a woman with a bad reputation made her way into a dinner party. She opened an alabaster jar of ointment and anointed Christ feet, but not before she wet them with her tears. The Pharisees argued a true man of God would not have let the woman touch Him. Christ then had to give them a lesson about mercy.

This scene repeats itself in the 12th chapter of John, and the 14th chapter of Mark, the night before Palm Sunday. A woman (Mary, of Martha and Mary fame) anointed Christ's feet with a pound of aromatic nard, filling the whole home with a goodly fragrance. Judas cried foul, claiming the nard could have been sold and the proceeds given to the poor. Christ told Judas to leave her alone, for it was practice for His upcoming burial.

Cease not, wet eyes,
His mercy to entreat;
To cry for vengeance
Sin doth never cease.

We can assume Mary Magdalene, often pictured kneeling at the foot of the cross, wept ceaselessly during Christ's Passion. And sin, willful disobedience of our Lord, never ceases. It cries out to heaven for vengeance. For that reason, our tears should never cease. For it is our sins that nail those feet to the cross. Kneeling at the altar of Calvary at Holy Mass we should bathe those nailed feet with tears.

So, tears should flow. But let's remember something very important: Mary Magdalene found the tomb empty on Sunday morning. She, who was always at our Lord's feet, noticed the nail holes in them. Rabbi! She then fell once again at His feet and would not let go. She bathed those beauteous feet again, but this time her tears were not tears of sorrow, but tears of joy.

And so, always mindful of our sins, and the price Christ paid for them, but also filled with hope in His promise for those who repent, we joyfully carry our own crosses and endure our own Passions during our very short stay on earth.

In your deep flood
Drown all my faults and fears;
Nor let His eye
See sin. but through my tears.

O kind and merciful savior, from my heart I earnestly desire to return Thee love for love. And I wish to offer Thee this act of love in reparation for the coldness and neglect that are shown to Thee in the sacrament of Thy love by Thy creatures. Rule over me, and transform my soul into the likeness of Thyself, so that it may bless and glorify Thee forever in the abode of the saints.
