




ROMANS 10:17

Introit – SS Peter & Paul (Acts 12: 11)

Now I am sure that the Lord has really sent his angel and rescued me from Herod's power and from all that the Jewish people were expecting. (Ps 138: 1-2) Vs. Lord, thou hast searched me and known me, thou knowest when I sit and when I rise.



A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR FR. KEVIN DREW

(The Conversion of St Paul, January 25)



Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, June 29

In 1871 archeologists in Israel discovered a stone plaque written in Greek and Latin that hung up in the temple in Christ's time. It was posted at the dividing wall that separated the outer court from the inner court. Anyone from anywhere could congregate in the outer court of the temple, the Court of the Gentiles. But only Jews could go in the inner court, as it was nearer the sanctuary where Jewish worship took place.

The sign said: *Gentiles enter under pain of death.* That's right. "Come in here, and we will kill you." That is quite a change from today's worship experience, wouldn't you say? We now have smiley-faced greeters with name tags that welcome anyone into the inner courts of our temples. We are not as discriminating as the ancient Jews.

In the Acts of the Apostles, St Paul was arrested on the false charge that he let his Gentile friend in the inner court of the temple. Certain Jews in town from Ephesus where they had seen Paul once preach, got the mob so riled up that they were all set to kill Paul. They caused such a commotion that Roman soldiers had to intervene.

The Roman Fortress, the Antonia stood at the northwest end of the temple. It actually overlooked the temple. Romans stood guard on top of it and when the Jews misbehaved, all the soldiers had to do was run down two flights of steps and they were in the temple.

The Romans agreed to let Paul, bloodied and bruised, give a speech to the Jews. Now, most men at this point would be looking for their lawyers and revenge. Paul could have said: "I am a Roman citizen and you all are going to pay for what you just did to me." Instead, in his bloody and beaten state, Paul gave testimony. He witnessed to Christ. He told them how he was a zealous persecutor of the Way (it was not called Christianity yet), and then he described his conversion. He turned an ugly incident into a wonderful opportunity to win people over to the truth.

St John Chrysostom wrote: *There is nothing weaker, in fact, than many sinners – and nothing stronger than a man who keeps the law of God.* In Paul's weakness, he was strong. St Theresa of Avila wrote: *The soldiers of Christ, that is those who pray, do not think of the time when they will have to fight, they never fear public enemies; for they already know them and they realize that nothing can withstand the strength the Lord has given them, and that they will always be victors and heaped with gain (Way of Perfection).*

The great Apostle Paul is looking down on us today. He is smiling because we Gentiles are worshipping inside the temple. He is also praying we take courage. At certain times in our lives we will be treated unjustly. Whether we take a physical beating or more likely we just get our ego bruised, we need to hold fast, because there is nothing stronger than a man who keeps the law of God. In doing so, we will turn ugly incidents into wonderful opportunities to witness to Christ, and win people over to the truth.
