The Married Couples Retreat is an introduction to the Domestic Church Movement, a simple, beautiful gift of formation, support, and true, organic growth in love and faith within the Sacrament of Marriage. Couples may attend the retreat simply to benefit their relationship. Following the retreat they may join a monthly small group where they will receive support and formation to live out the 7 Commitments of the Domestic Church Movement, a set of simple and ordinary actions – lived in the family and home. This formation was developed by the founder, Servant of God, Fr. Blachnicki, under the direction of Archbishop Karol Wotyla (before he became Pope St. John Paul II). The commitments of this movement are principles that couples commit to live in

their ordinary family life; things like praying daily as individuals, as a couple, and with their family. The movement provides for mation, using the Church's spiritual tradition and official teachings, for how to pray, how to use Scripture in prayer, and how to grow in relationship with God, spouse, and children. The decisions about specific ways to do this are up to the family because they are a domestic church. There are a

St. Mary's Home for Mothers


ST. ANN CATHOLIC CHURCH



Dear Friends in Christ-



In the ancient Roman Calendar of the Church, this Sunday began the season of Septuagesima or 70 symbolic days before Easter. In this very short pre-Lenten two-and-a-half week season, we can still consider what

we're going to do for Lent this year. You see, if we wait until the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, we're only going to start implementing our regimen the third week of Lent. That's just human nature. So, now is the time to start thinking!

During this two-and-a-half week period, the Church classically gives us the patriarchs in the Book of Genesis over which to meditate daily. We begin this Sunday with the story of the Garden of Eden. We will hear this same story again at the Easter Vigil as a sort of "bookend" to the whole story. Below, I list the scriptural readings in the book of Matins in the Roman Breviary for the week. They are short clips of the Book of Genesis. We not only contemplate our beginnings as a human family, we also contemplate Original Sin and our state of concupiscence and how during Lent, our penitential practice which includes self-denial and bodily penance, will cause us to be reordered like the Risen Christ.


