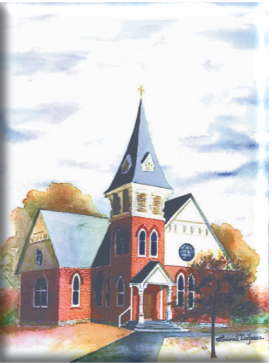

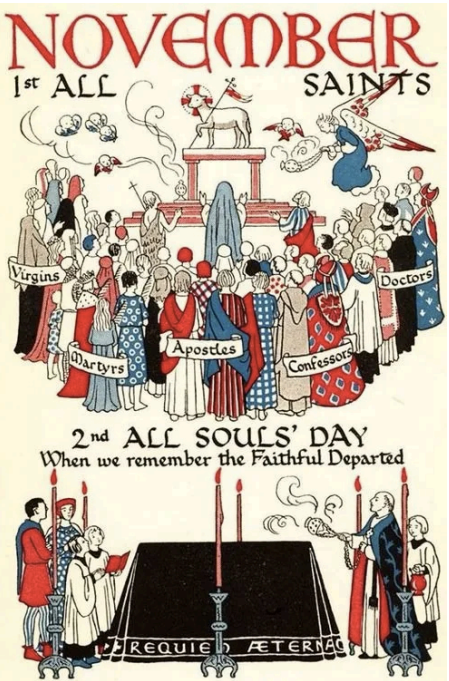

Dear Friends in Christ,

In addition to our open house this weekend on Sunday afternoon, we will also celebrate this week All Saints Day and All Souls Day. This penultimate month of the year causes us to reflect not only on the eschaton, the appearance of the Lord in His Glory at the Final Judgment, but also to reflect in particular on our own judgment. The cult or veneration of the saints goes back to the first centuries of Christianity when Holy Mass would be offered on the burial sites of the martyrs or those who witnessed to the Faith by their death. They were united to the Lord's cross by their death making it fitting to offer the Eucharistic Sacrifice on their resting places. From this seedbed of martyrs come the Church's virgins, widows, confessors, kings, etc. All witnessing not always by red martyrdom or physical death, but by white martyrdom, or dying to themselves spiritually and living the cross. The saints are like the many colors of the prism in which we get to see the Life of Christ lived out over and over again regardless of the time period and in the particular circumstances of each saint. By the merits that the saints have earned through their works of charity (remember charity is the Love of God), they are able to intercede for us who are still on earth. Their love for God is more intense than ours because they are in complete union with Him. This is why we ask for their prayers. All Souls day reminds us not only of our own particular judgment before God, but also that the bond of charity still exists between those who are being purified in purgation and we who are followers of the Lord on earth. The economy of charity demands that we pray for these souls knowing that our prayers and sacrifices help them to attain the Beatific Vision. When we offer Holy Mass for our deceased loved ones, that is exactly what we are doing. While All Saints day is a Holy Day of Obligation, I do hope you will take the time to come and pray with us for All Souls Day as well, remembering and praying for our beloved dead.
