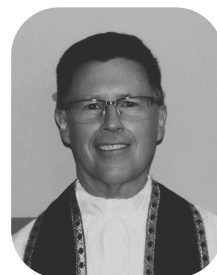

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. DREW

FATIMA. OCTOBER 13TH

Here is what the New York Times published on January 26, 1938: *London, January 25, 1938.*

The Aurora Borealis, rarely seen in Southern or Western Europe spread fear in parts of Portugal and lower Austria tonight while thousands of Britons were brought running into the streets in wonderment. The ruddy glow led many to think half the city was ablaze. The Windsor Fire Department was called out thinking that Windsor Castle was afire. The lights were clearly seen in Italy, Spain, and even Gibraltar. The glow bathing snow-clad mountain tops in Austria and Switzerland was a beautiful sight but firemen turned out to chase non-existent fires. Portuguese villagers rushed in fright from their homes fearing the end of the world.

On Jan. 25, 1938, fear struck the hearts of millions around the world. A bizarre phenomenon lit up the sky across Europe and could even be seen as far west as Bermuda. Many thought the world was ending. The next day, the newspapers were calling it an aurora borealis. But others remembered what Our Lady of Fatima had told the three shepherd children on July 13, 1917. She said, "When you see a night illuminated by an unknown light, know that it is the great sign that God gives you that He is going to punish the world for its crimes by means of war, famine and persecution of the Church and the Holy Father." Less than a month later, Hitler marched his army into Austria, and [the next] September, he invaded Poland. (Divine Mercy Org)

Who was Our Lady of Fatima?

On May, 13, 1917, an apparition of 'a woman all in white, more brilliant than the sun' presented herself to three children tending sheep saying "Please don't be afraid of me, I'm not going to harm you." When asked, the woman wearing a white mantle edged with gold and rosary in hand, answered, "I am from heaven." The woman asked them to make acts of reparation and sacrifice and "say the Rosary every day, to bring peace to the world and an end to the war."

The war was World War I, a bloody carnage like the world had never seen before, and the start of the suicide of Europe. An armistice was signed a few weeks after Our Lady's last of six apparitions to the children on October 13, 1917. She however predicted that if people did not turn back to God and make acts of reparation, an even worse war would break out during the reign of Pope Pius XI. He was the Pope in 1938 when the strange light appeared in the sky.

In the last apparition the woman revealed her name in response to Lucia's question: "I am the Lady of the Rosary." In that last apparition, 70,000 people came. They saw the sun make three circles and move around the sky in an incredible zigzag movement in a manner which left no doubt in their minds about the veracity of the apparitions. By 1930 the Bishop in Fatima had approved of the apparitions and they have been approved by the Church as authentic. Christ Himself warned to watch for signs in the sky. So, they are there. Are they mere acts of nature or acts of God? Well, they're both, since God is Lord of nature. Christ gave signs of His divinity while on earth. And He gave us His Mother as a powerful weapon against darkness. At Fatima Our lady confidently declared, "My Immaculate Heart will triumph".

And there is our confidence.
