



A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. DREW

HALLOWEEN, ALL SAINTS, ALL SOULS ...

What is Halloween, and why is it on October 31? Well. what does the word *Halloween* mean? It is actually a contraction of words. It is short for All Hallows Evening. That means All Saints Evening.

Saint and hallow are synonyms. So, we need to examine the feast of All Saints to understand Halloween.

From the earliest of times the Church honored the martyrs and collected their relics. In the Early Church, Mass was said on the tombs of martyrs. As time progressed, churches were built in honor of the martyrs. But all too guickly there were more martyrs than churches or days of the year. So, the Church started a feast for all the martyrs.

Later on, the feast included not just martyrs, but all the saints. In the 8th century the church of All Saints was dedicated in Rome on November 1, and the Pope transferred the feast of All Saints to that day. All Souls Day, celebrated on November 2, became common in the 10th century. So, Halloween is still theoretically the vigil for All Saints Day. (Important feasts traditionally had a vigil, a day that served as a preparation for the feast. Think of Christmas Eve.)

So, for about 1100 years, All Hallows Evening was the start of a triduum, a three-day event traditionally known as All Hallowtide which included the Church Militant on earth, the Church Triumphant in heaven, and the Church Suffering in purgatory.

PURGATORY: "A JOYOUS HELL, A SAD HEAVEN."

Scripture states it is a holy and pious thought to pray for the dead (1 Maccabees 12:43-46). Why is it holy and pious? Consider: The Poor Souls have no temptations like are found in this life, but they suffer intensely because they are shut out from their one all-consuming desire. They have been given a glimpse of eternal happiness with God, but they are separated from it. Once that alimpse is given, the soul will desire nothing else. Nothing.

And to make things worse, the Poor Souls realize this separation is their own fault. If they would have sinned less on earth or made greater satisfaction for sin in this life, which is a time of mercy, they would not be helplessly waiting things out in the time of justice. One consolation for them is that they understand that someday their torment will end. So Purgatory has been described as "A joyous Hell, a sad Heaven."

The Poor Souls have another consolation. They understand that people pray for them in order to shorten their time of purification. Our prayers and good works are spiritual works of mercy that bring refreshment to these suffering souls. What act of charity is greater than that? What can be more pleasing to God than by helping souls who cannot help themselves? (See Ripley, This is the Faith).

Purgatory exists and souls detained there can be helped by our intercessory prayer. And what is the most effective prayer for this holy mission? The Council of Trent stated it is the acceptable Sacrifice of the Altar (Holy Mass). How could it not be? Mass is the perfect prayer, because it is Christ's prayer, His offering to his Father at the Eternal Sacrifice of Calvary.

At Mass Christ's Mystical Blood is poured out for the forgiveness of sins. That Blood cleanses us on earth, and it douses the purging fire of those Q suffering in purgatory. We can act in a most excellent and noble way by having Mass offered for the Poor Souls. And we can be assured, once those souls are released and become saints in heaven, that they are in a splendid position to intercede for us.
