A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. DREW

\odot ST. MARTIN OF TOURS. NOVEMBER 11TH

Why are priests in the Armed Forces called "chaplains"? Studying the life of St Martin of Tours gives us our answer.

Martin, born in 316 A.D. of pagan parents was named after Mars, the Roman god of war. As a young child he was drawn to Christianity and took instruction in secret. Desiring to become a monk, but before he could be baptized, Martin was forced to join the army at age fifteen. Nevertheless, he was a good soldier and became an officer, stationed in Gaul, which is modern day France.

There is a town in the north of France called Amiens. If you look it up you will come upon some beautiful images, especially of the massive cathedral, built in the 13th century (when they really knew how to build churches.) The Battle of Amiens in 1918 was the turning point of World War I. It was in Amiens that the bloody stalemate of trench warfare was broken. You see, something new was introduced in that battle tanks. Human flesh was no match for the machine gun, but armored vehicles were. One hundred days after the Battle of Amiens the armistice ending the war was signed. The date was November 11th (today) 1918.

Something new was also introduced in Amiens about 1600 years earlier; something few people had ever seen or considered – Christian charity. It was on this garrison duty at Amiens that the event took place that has been portrayed in art throughout the ages. On a bitterly cold winter day, the young tribune Martin rode through the gates, probably dressed in the regalia of his unit – gleaming flexible armor, ridged helmet, and a beautiful white cloak whose upper section was lined with lambswool. As he approached the gates he saw a beggar, with clothes so ragged that he was practically naked.

The beggar must have been shaking and blue from the cold but no one reached out to help him. Martin, overcome with compassion, took off his mantle. In one quick stroke, he slashed the lovely mantle in two with his sword, handed half to the freezing man and wrapped the remainder on his own shoulders. Many in the crowd thought this was so ridiculous a sight that they laughed and jeered but some realized that they were seeing Christian goodness.

That night Martin dreamed that he saw <u>lesus</u> wearing the half mantle he had given the beggar. Jesus said to the angels and saints that surrounded him, "See! This is the mantle that Martin, yet a catechumen, gave me." When he woke, it was the "yet a catechumen" that spurred Martin to get immediately baptized. He was eighteen years old. (Saints and Angels).

After his discharge from the army Martin, by the will of the people, became the bishop of Tours in west-central France. After his death in 308 he became the first person to be made a saint that was not martyred. St. Martin of Tours is the patron saint of soldiers.

The cape that he had cut in half was put in an ornate box and this sacred cloak was carried into battlefields by priests who would say Mass for the soldiers. These priests became known as the capebearers, the capellani in Latin, which evolved into the French word chapeleyn, or what we say today in English, chaplain.


A Divine Day of Vacation every week.
