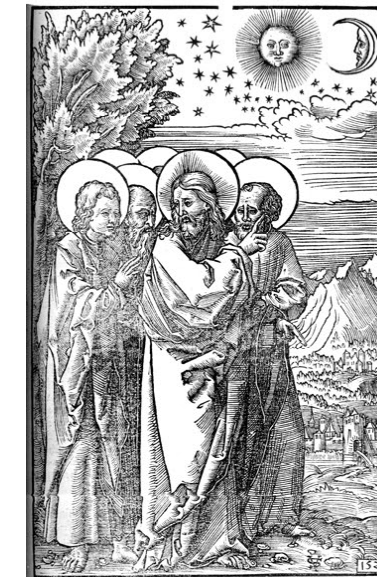

Dear Friends In Christ,

This Sunday is the last “Green Sunday,” if you will, as we are about to close the liturgical year and begin a new one in two weeks on the First Sunday of Advent. At the end of every liturgical year, we always hear about the end of the world, the apocalypse, the clashing of time with eternity and the glorious return of Christ to judge the living and the dead. Because we are both body and soul as human beings and not one or the other, when our souls are separated from our bodies at death, their natural place is still the human body. Because of Original Sin, our bodies decay, yet Christ promises a glorious resurrection when the scientific matter that was our body on earth will be re-created and gloriously resurrected and not subject to pain or death. A simple catechism question that often arises with regard to this topic is, “I thought we were already judged when we die?” This is called a particular judgment, when our soul goes before Christ, the Just Judge. The Four Last Things come into play here—Death, judgment, heaven and hell. We die, we are judged, and we either attain eternal glory or we are condemned. And yes, there is a hell. Yes, people do go there. There is a heaven, or eternal beatitude with God, and people go there as well. Not everyone who dies automatically goes to heaven. We are judged on the state of our souls. The Final Judgment is when all of these things are made visible in our resurrected bodies. St. Thomas teaches that there is a resurrection of the damned and of the blessed. The blessed have glorified bodies, like Christ on Easter, and are not subject to space, time, pain, or sin. The resurrection of the damned includes those souls being reunited with their bodies and showing the effects of their sin. We are body and soul as human beings. The Last Judgment is when all things become visible. The unseen becomes gloriously or painfully, as the matter might be, seen for all. This is part of God’s Divine Justice. November is also a time where we pray for those in Purgatory who are before the throne of God waiting to be cleansed of any remaining venial sin or paying a debt of justice that was not paid in life. We can only make moral decisions while our souls are in our bodies (a human person). These souls in purgation rely on our prayers and sacrifices. This is the true bond of charity we share with those who have gone before us. As we think of the End Times, our particular judgment and the Final Judgment at the Apocalypse and the Glorious Coming of Christ for Whom we eagerly wait, let us examine our own lives and ready ourselves.

Next Sunday, on the Solemnity of Christ the King, after the 10:00am Mass, we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Together we will consecrate ourselves and the human race to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, honor the Blessed Mother and receive the graces of Benediction before embarking on a new year of grace.

DE PROFUNDIS -PSALM 130
The psalmist is crying out here from the depression that grips him because of his sense of sin. He tells God that no man could be forgiven should strict justice be demanded; but, since God is forgiving and merciful, the psalmist (Israel) will hope for redemption from iniquities. We, who know the mercy of God far better than the Israelites, may pray this psalm with even greater trust in God. The Church uses this psalm in the liturgy as her official prayer for the souls in Purgatory.
