Dear Friends In Christ,

This Sunday is the Last Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Christ the King in the modern Roman Calendar. It is not only a time where we think of the Four Last Things and the Final Judgement of humanity or the Resurrection of the Body, but principally and originally, it was a time where we recognize Christ as King of our society and of the temporal realm. For those of us (most of the world) who live in a classically liberal style of government as opposed to the classically conservative style (monarchy), the concept of the Kingship of Christ may seem foreign, yet the hierarchy or "holy order" of Heaven is not a democracy or a republic. These are human inventions of societal government. In the spiritual realm, God is King who has the Divine Prerogative and the Divine Right to rule or govern the universe. He governs the laws of nature, of human morality, of reality. Our rational participation in the Eternal Law of God is called "the natural law." When Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the Word made Flesh, appears in Galilee a little over 2,000 years ago and begins His public ministry, He clearly proclaims that the Kingdom of God is upon us. Our response is supposed to be repentance to receive this spiritual reality of God's Presence.

While many search for peace and tranquility in society with violence, human revolution, rebellion and an attitude of self-sovereignty or even the erroneous recognition that human freedom is equal with license or "whatever I can physically do," no society will have tranquility of order until it publicly recognizes the sovereign rights of God Himself. Any legitimate human law has to be in accord with the Eternal Law of God, lest it is unjust. To recognize Christ as King and ruler of our lives, both public and private, brings peace not only to society, but also to our individual souls. As Christians, we are to publicly promote the reign of Jesus Christ in society—whether that be in voting, public discourse, or our public or private lives. Just as we are body and soul and not one or the other, our moral or visible physical lives are not cleaved by saying one thing and doing another, and nor shall our Faith and our public manifestation thereof be cleaved or compartmentalized. Let us boldly proclaim Christ as King in our personal lives, our families, and our society. He is the true King of Peace!

Thank you to our Knights of Columbus and the ladies of our parish for putting on our annual Chili Supper this weekend after 4:00pm Mass.

MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS

DE PROFUNDIS -PSALM 130

The psalmist is crying out here from the depression that grips him because of his sense of sin. He tells God that no man could be forgiven should strict justice be demanded; but, since God is forgiving and merciful, the psalmist (Israel) will hope for redemption from iniquities. We, who know the mercy of God far better than the Israelites, may pray this psalm with even greater trust in God. The Church uses this psalm in the liturgy as her official prayer for the souls in Purgatory.

Let Your ears be attentive to my voice in supplication:
If You, O Lord, mark iniquities, Lord, who can stand?
But with You is forgiveness, that You may be revered.
