Dear Friends In Christ,

In this month of November, the Church oids us to consider the Four Last Things— Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell. Whether we want to think about this reality or not, it is before us. Not seriously considering our mortality or our judgment pefore Jesus Christ does not somehow manipulate the reality that every human being will face this threshold. In both the Book of Maccabees and the Holy Gospel, we see the resurrection of the body is

mentioned. The resurrection unto eternal life and the resurrection unto death. St. Thomas Aquinas in elucidating this spiritual reality of life and death literally being enfleshed teaches us that what we cannot see now will become visible at the Final Judgement. For those who die in a state of grace and whose souls are in complete union with the Blessed Trinity, the matter of which their earthly bodies were composed will be glorified. Remember, matter cannot be destroyed, it scientifically may change from a solid to a gas, etc., but it will be miraculously glorified and not be subject to any space or time. It will have the glory or *claritas* light of the Blessed Trinity shine through it. If one was martyred for the Faith, the wounds of that particular saint will be visible, but will cause no more pain for the resurrected body can no longer experience the effects of death or sin. Those who resurrect in the resurrection of the damned will wear the effects of their sinfulness on their bodies. This is a horrifying thought, but it is an analogue to the resurrection of the blessed. All things will be made visible that are unseen, especially any unconfessed sins that have not been forgiven by the Blood of the Lamb.

To meditate on the resurrection of the body and life everlasting is a harrowing thought. It is both terrifying can be comforting to know that there is an end to sin and death based on our acceptance of the Faith and living it in charity now and our eternal destination. For those who are in final purgation, we have an obligation as Christians to participate in the treasury of merit for them who can no longer merit for themselves (having no bodies anymore) and to pray for their happy repose. It is in this way that we participate in bond of charity that connects the living and the dead. May we live our lives honestly and with the supernatural virtue of Faith so that when we are called to judgement before the throne of the Just Judge, we may be ready to render an account.

### **DE PROFUNDIS PSALM 130**

The psalmist is crying out here from the depression that grips him because of his sense of sin. He tells God that no man could be forgiven should strict justice be demanded; but, since God is forgiving and merciful, the psalmist (Israel) will hope for redemption from iniquities. We, who know the mercy of God far better than the Israelites, may pray this psalm with even greater trust in God. The Church uses this psalm in the liturgy as her official prayer for the souls in Purgatory.

Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord; Lord, hear my, voice! Let Your ears be attentive to my voice in supplication: If You, O Lord, mark iniquities, Lord, who can stand? But with You is forgiveness, that You may be revered. I trust in the Lord; my soul trusts in His word. My soul waits for the Lord more than sentinels wait for the dawn. More than sentinels wait for the dawn, let Israel wait for the Lord, For with the Lord is kindness and with Him is plenteous redemption: And He will redeem Israel from all their iniquities.
