# MARGARET BALL. IRISH SAINTS. NOVEMBER 6

What happened to Halloween? Why, when and how did it turn into such the evil creep-fest it has become? Well, being Irish, I feel I am allowed to blame ... the Irish for Halloween.

Someone recently wrote: *Long before the first Spirit Halloween store* opened, there were spirits afoot in the cold, sparse, sad days of late October. Our spiritual ancestors in Ireland called this time Samhain (SOW-wen). when the veil between heaven and earth disappeared and tombs were opened "to allow the spirits of the dead to emerge and mingle with the living," as writers Carmel McCaffrey and Leo Eaton put it in In Search of *Ancient Ireland. It was a time of feasting and celebration — the most* popular holiday of the year — when the living appeased the dead with treats to avoid mischief from beyond the grave.

It's no surprise that when Christians arrived in the fifth century, they kept this pagan practice but baptized it with a new name, morphing it into the sugar-laden trick-or-treat day we know as Halloween, followed by the Christian feasts of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day, when we remember the great cloud of witnesses gone before us, living in the glow of light perpetual.

In 1921, when Ireland was fighting its War for Independence from England, Pope Benedict XV declared November 6 a feast day for all the Irish Saints. One of them is Blessed Margaret Ball. There is a statue of her outside Dublin Castle, where she died in prison in 1584.

Margaret Ball was wealthy, her husband being the Lord Mayor of Dublin. But trouble started when the English government mandated that its Irish colony follow the new "reformed" religion, which really wasn't a reform, but a re-hash of old heresies. After Margaret's husband died, her oldest son Walter became the Lord Mayor.

Walter, most likely for political reasons, renounced his faith and became Protestant, while his mother, Margaret kept the faith, even going so far as hiding priests in her home, and having them offer the outlawed Mass. As a result, her home was raided several times. As the result of yet another raid, Walter had his 65-year-old mother arrested and put in a dark, dank prison cell with no natural light. She died in prison three years later.

Walter, being Margaret's oldest son, stood to inherit the family fortune. It's interesting that Margaret could have struck him out of her will, but she didn't. Perhaps she thought that act of love might soften him and get him to revert to the one true faith and save his soul.

I wonder what happened to Walter? Did he publicly repent? Did he return to the sacraments on his death bed? Do you think he is the Lord Mayor of wherever he is today?

Go to a cemetery today (and for the rest of November) and pray for the poor souls. Perhaps pray for Walter, a man who sold out his mother for a bit of earthly power. Pray for people like him. And pray for the faithful departed, who left this life in the state of grace, but are in need of purification. Pray they are soon released from their dark dank purgatorial prisons. Pray they are set free to live in the light of peace, forever.

# HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY

The month of November is dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. The Church commemorates all her faithful children who have departed from this life, but have not yet attained the joys of heaven. St. Paul warns us that we must not be ignorant concerning the dead, nor sorrowful, "even as others who have no hope ... For the Lord Himself shall come down from heaven ... and the dead who are in Christ shall rise.

The Church has always taught us to pray for those who have gone into eternity. Even in the Old Testament prayers and alms were offered for the souls of the dead by those who thought "well and religiously concerning the resurrection." It was believed that "they who had fallen asleep with godliness had great grace laid up for them" and that "it is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they may be loosed from sins." We know that a defiled soul cannot enter into heaven.
