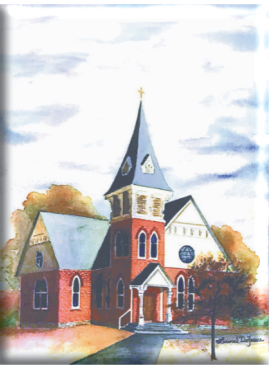

Dear Friends in Christ,

A very Blessed and Merry Christmas to all! I would like to thank everyone who made the Feast of Our Dedication one of great importance and memory for our parish. For all of you who sacrificed so much, I am deeply moved and appreciative!

As we celebrate the birth of our Savior, we contemplate the meaning of God being made visible, so that we can be caught up in things invisible. Few know that the story of Christmas simply begins on December 25. The Church honors this great feast with an octave, or eight days of principle celebration. These eight days in which we celebrate a different saint everyday and relate him to the Nativity, represent a privileged time of rest. Please check the Mass schedule at St. Ann for this coming week, as it has changed so that we might more fully celebrate this sacred time. As there were 7 days in creation, the seventh representing a day of rest or an “8th day” of contemplation and eternal recreation, the theme of Christmas is extended as if the week were one whole day. After the 8 days in which we end with celebrating Mary, Mother of God or the Circumcision of the Lord and the reception of His Holy Name, we continue until day 12 to celebrate the Epiphany. From here, the Christmas cycle is extended all the way until February 2nd where we celebrate the Lord as “Light of the World” being presented in the Temple. Christmas is merely the beginning of our Redemption. For today, a Savior is born unto us, Christ the Lord. Mary and Joseph look on as the light shines forth from the crib on which our Savior lays. Come, let us adore Him!
