

Dear Friends in Christ,

A Happy Father's Day to all of the fathers in our parish! This Sunday, we begin the long and very 'green" journey through the rest of the year— Time Through the Year. The External Feast of Corpus Christi having been celebrated last Sunday as well as the Feast of the Sacred Heart

last Friday, we can begin to turn our attention to our mission as disciples of Christ. Formerly called "Time after Pentecost," it is one of the times of the year that we literally live in now. In other words, we are living after Pentecost. This time of year is punctuated with various saints and also a few principal feasts which come each month. While June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart, July is dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of Christ. In August, we focus on the Assumption of the Blessed Mother and her Immaculate Heart, in September the Exaltation of the Cross and the traditional ember days, in October, the Holy Rosary, November, praying for the dead, and finally we end up at the beginning of the liturgical year again. This half of the year brings us a steady rhythm in the spiritual life where we can now meditate and digest the principal truths of our faith. Each first Sunday of the month, you will also hear a sermon dedicated to a principal truth on our belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament to celebrate the Eucharistic Revival in our country.
