Greetings from Fr. Drew,

Matthew 9:18-26. Monday of 14th Week of Ordinary Time

What did Jesus look like? He most likely had a beard and longer hair because most Jewish men in Christ's time had beards and longer hair. What kind of clothes did Christ wear? We're not really sure, but we do know that Jews wore longer garments, similar to what I'm wearing for Mass.

What about a jacket or some kind of overcoat? Would Christ have worn one of those? Probably. How do we know this? The gospel writer Matthew, one of Christ's Apostles, gives us a small detail in today's gospel passage. The sick woman saw Jesus and she said to herself: If only I could touch the tassel of his cloak I can be cured.

A tassel is like a piece of string or cord that Jews had hanging from their coats to identify themselves to the world. Jews had these tassels because God told them to put them there. The Jewish law stated they had to have tassels on their coat. Jesus was a Jew and He followed the Jewish law.

After the Jews in Moses' time escaped from the Egyptians by crossing over the Red Sea, God told Moses to have the Jewish people put blue tassels on the corners of their garments. (The Red Sea isn't red; it is very blue.) The tassels were reminders of the commandments and that the Jews were made in the image of God. Therefore, they were to live by God's commands (Num 15:37). So, Christ had some kind of jacket, maybe like a poncho that He put on over His head. And on the four corners, front and back, were cords of blue.

Try to picture the scene: An official, a very important person, had the humility to kneel down before Christ and beg Him to bring his daughter back to life. There was a big crowd pressed all around Jesus as He walked to the official's home. All were intensely curious as to what Christ would do. How could He raise a girl from the dead? That was impossible.

This was when the sick woman took a chance. The Jewish law stated a sick person with a bleeding problem was not supposed to touch anyone. But she believed in the impossible. For all things are possible with God. And so, she broke the law. She reached out and touched one of Christ's tassels on His coat – and she was instantly cured. Due to the crowd pressing in on Him, Christ had to turn around and say: Who touched me? (Mark 5:30). That made the woman, who just broke the law, afraid. But what did Christ tell her? Courage, daughter. Do not be afraid. Your faith has saved you.

This is Christ's message to us: Do not be afraid. Have faith in me, even when things seem impossible. That is then what we do. We come to the Sacrifice of Mass and we humbly get on our knees, just like that important official. We get on our knees and say to Christ: Only say the word and my soul shall be healed. And look how blessed we are. We don't just get to touch a tassel of Christ's coat; we get to have Christ Himself placed on our tongue. We get to be fed like the children of God we are. So, courage, children. Be not afraid. Our faith will save us.

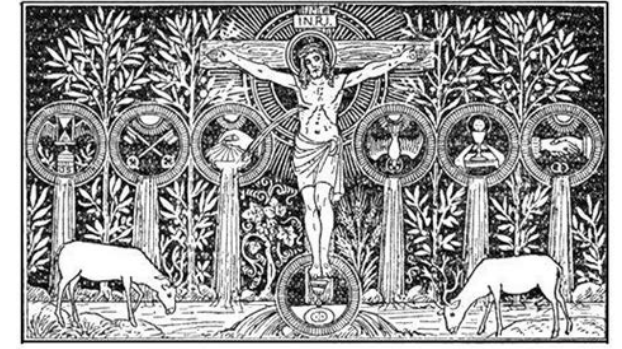
