

Dear Friends in Christ,

Happy Fourth of July! In today's Gospel, the Lord makes the definition of "loving" God" very clear—we are to love nothing or no one above Him. This is much different from the Pagan relationship with the gods

wherein one makes ritualistic measures to appease the capriciousness of the god. Even the gods in Greek mythology are much more human than they are divine. Divinity, one could say, is more or less the power to destroy in this milieu. The God of Israel is different. He is the One True God for all of the universe. And this God, our God, became man and walked among us. His name is Jesus or God-saves. God wills that we have a relationship with Him which implies, because He is a Divine Person, that we truly love Him above all created things. This, hard as it may sound, Jesus commands us to do.
