FROM OUR PASTOR

DEAR FRIENDS IN CHRIST,



We learn from Sacred Scripture today about the concept of mediation. This means, practically, that in order to show His glory, God uses a means to transmit grace to His people. If we look at the mystery of the Annunciation when the Blessed Mother is overshadowed with the Holy Spirit—it is not the

voice of God telling her this message, it is the voice of the Archangel Gabriel. When we examine the Temple in Jerusalem, there is a clear hierarchy of the priesthood—the high priest, the priestly class, and the Levites or those who prepare the sacrifice of the altar. And it is the High Priest that St. Paul in his letter to the Hebrews is describing in relationship to Christ. Every year at Yom Kippur, the High Priest would enter into the Holy of Holies behind the sacred curtain and sprinkle the blood of a bull in expiation for the sins of Israel. Yom Kippur is the Jewish new year which takes place typically sometime in September. Recently, there was an article on our Roman Tradition of the Ember Days or four sets of three days where Latin Rite Catholics would fast and abstain for the clergy and in thanksgiving for the fruits of the earth. One of these sets always falls around the Jewish Feast of Yom Kippur. In Christian dispensation, Christ is the High Priest who pierces this veil because He is the Presence of the God of Israel Himself. And when He offers Himself on the cross for our salvation, He enters once and for all. Holy Mass, then, with a validly ordained priest in the person of Christ perpetuates this mystery over and over again so that we can enter into the once sacrifice offered once and for all. On each of our Christian altars, we enter into this mystery through the ordained ministry of the Christian priesthood. The Catholic priest is another mediator whom God uses to dispense His grace to all of us. And much like the high priest of old, must also offer the sacrifice for himself, for he, too is sinful and is chosen from among men. This is the meaning of the Christian sanctuary oriented (at least liturgically) towards the east with an elevated platform. It symbolizes the old and the new. It symbolizes the Temple from which our tradition comes and the Heavenly Jerusalem made present by the celebration of Holy Mass and by entering again and again into the sacrifice offered by Christ for our salvation.

Next week, on Monday, November 1st, we will have All Saints Mass at 7:00PM (Ordinary Form). This year, November 1st is not a holy day of obligation. In addition, we will also celebrate All Souls Day (November 2nd) at 7:00pm with a High Requiem Mass. I will tell you more about this next week, but the ceremony of All Souls is particular to the day—a somber, once-a-year opportunity not only to pray for the souls in purgatory, but also to reflect on our own death. It is a difficult topic, but one that the Church wisely calls to our minds before we enter into the new liturgical year at Advent and prepare for Christmas.
