IMPORTANT TAX INFORMATION REGARDING CHARITABLE GIVING IN 2021

Congress has extended some of the provisions found in the CARES Act providing additional tax benefits for charitable giving in 2021:

- Individuals who do NOT itemize their tax deductions may continue to take a \$300 "above the line" charitable deduction (\$600 for a married couple). An "above the line" deduction reduces a donor's adjusted gross income (AGI), thereby reduces taxable income.
- Individuals who itemize may continue to deduct donations up to 100% of their 2021 AGI.

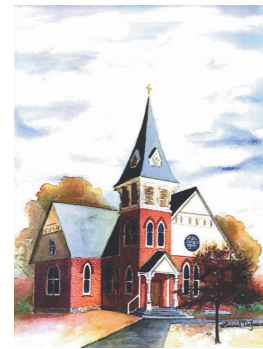
If you have reasonable cause to suspect sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult, you must call:

St. John the Baptist is the forerunner of Christ. He is the “angel” that is sent before the LORD in Matthew’s Gospel. As the last prophet and the bridge between the Old and New

Covenants, St. John preaches the coming of the Messiah, the Anointed One, the Christ.
