DEAR FRIENDS IN CHRIST-

On this Fifth Sunday of Lent, we see Jesus being tested by the scribes and Pharisees who desire to apply the death penalty to a prostitute which would be stoning. Notice that they don't want to stone the man who was caught with her. While we really don't know what Jesus writes on the ground, some Church Fathers say it was the commandments broken by the accusers. Jesus shows both justice and mercy in His Divine judgment. He doesn't will her death, but her salvation. His command expresses forgiveness and also asks for contrition (that she not sin anymore). The Pharisaical way of responding to sin was to eradicate the person who committed it. Contrast this with eradicating the sin in one's life for a life of grace and not the person.

The traditional Gospel for this Sunday was formerly very important because Jesus revealed Himself to be the God of Israel who existed before Abraham (I AM), and was subsequently almost stoned by the same people himself. He then hid Himself from the public. This marked the division of Lent called Passiontide where we would now focus on the cross and Passion of Christ in a more profound way. It seems counterintuitive to cover all of the images in the church including the cross, though. Right? In addition to fasting from food we now fast with our eyes and long to see Jesus on the cross revealed on Good Friday. The Church understood and understands human psychology well; when we get used to the same image of the cross every Sunday and all of the time, we can sadly "get used" to this image. The shrouds of mourning for Passiontide help our hearts grow in longing to see the cross again, which we will on Good Friday. It is important to note that any saint's image displayed in a church is a version wherein the individual is glorified. We shield ourselves from their glorified images for these two weeks as well as we await the resurrection of Our Lord from Whom they gain bodily glory and we will as well. We will see them again when we arrive at the empty tomb.

Next week is Palm Sunday. As a note of courtesy for you: Palm Sunday Vigil Mass (Saturday) at 4:00PM will be approximately the same length as any normative 4:00PM Mass. Sunday Mass at 10:00AM will include an outdoor procession with the palms and the reading of the Passion from St. Luke in its entirety. This will lengthen Mass considerably. Although Mass is lengthened, Palm Sunday begins the apex of the entire liturgical year—Holy Week. For all who wish to participate, I hope you do; for we will receive many graces as we begin to accompany the Lord into the Holy City for His Passion.

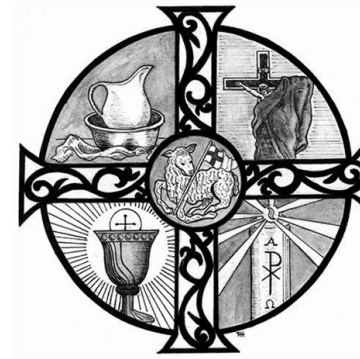
