

Dear Friends In Christ-

This weekend, we welcome Fr. Gabriel Landis, OSB from St. Benedict Abbey in Atchison, Kansas. In the Book of Deuteronomy, Moses tells the Israelite people that the Commandments of God are near to the people to whom they have been given. They are not off in a distant place, nor are they incomprehensible, to practice them is right in front of them. Many times, when we speak to God, we can include ourselves in the larger crowd. It is a temptation to think the words of Sacred Scripture apply to all of us generally, but not to "me" in particular. When we hear the words of Moses, the Prophets, or the Lord Jesus in the Gospel itself, do they echo within our own hearts or they really for someone else?

When Jesus recalls the story of the Good Samaritan, we learn how the commandments are perfected by an overabundance of goodness. This is the concept of mercy. Mercy is an oft-used term today that has little to do with the actual concept of mercy which is clearly delineated in the story of the Good Samaritan. The Samaritan people were considered unclean ritualistically and having contact with them could make one unclean. Even open wounds or fluid from a wound could make

someone "unclean." Here, we see that justice would've dictated that the Samaritan be charitable or help where he could out of communitive justice to one's neighbor. It wouldn't have necessarily meant that the Samaritan himself would have to bandage the wounds. He could've gotten help. Instead, he goes well beyond simply providing for his needs, he even volunteers to pay out an overabundance should the injured man's stay at the inn require more. This is mercy. An overabundance of goodness that we do not necessarily deserve. God is perfectly just and merciful. His overflowing goodness dictates that He gives us more than we deserve. When we hope in God, we can falter in two ways—either believing that there is no way we can be saved, so why try. This is a false belief of God's justice. Why would God treat us unjustly? It is against His nature. Or, we can presume. "No matter what I do, God is bound to be merciful." Either way shows a loss of hope. Rather, the virtue is in the mean. The Good Samaritan shows us how God is—we do not deserve to be picked up from where we were, yet, he pours wine and oil on us and gives us another chance. Let us go rejoicing to the Temple of God to give thanks for His mercy.
