Dear Friends In Christ-

What is the "better part" about which Our Lord is speaking? Classically speaking, this text was the root of our understanding of the active and contemplative life. The active religious life being more geared to an apostolate, the contemplative being focused simply on the Presence of God and prayer. Even those who are in the active life (religious men and women attached to an apostolate, or diocesan priests) have the duty to be rooted in the contemplative life. What does this mean for all Christians? It means that although we must toil, labor and work, that we, too must be rooted in the contemplative life, Scripturally expressed by kneeling at the feet of Jesus Christ and contemplating Him. In the Gospel of John, Our Lord clearly teaches that "you can do nothing without Me." He means this when He says it. Unless we are attached to Him, we are powerless to have a relationship with the

Triune God. He is our Mediator. In another place, when St. Phillip asks Jesus to show him the Father, Jesus retorts that the Apostles have been with Him all of this time and they still ask Him to show them the Father? In other words, we have access to Heaven through Jesus Alone. There is no other way. Truly, it is the contemplative life, the life of prayer in which we all must be rooted.

As a parish family, we have done so well this past year with Eucharistic Adoration. I'm very proud of you all. For those who have not experienced it, come in sometime and sit at the feet of the Master. He waits for you! When we sit at His feet as Mary did, He teaches us the way to live and the way to the Father.
