



FROM OUR PASTOR



DEAR FRIENDS IN CHRIST.

St. James hits on a point in today's Epistle that should form our whole being as Christians—the concept of word and deed or faith and works. At every Mass,

regardless of whether it is ancient or modern, we confess our sins and faults-verbo et opera-in word and deed. Just as we can sin in thought, word and deed and by extension, omission, we live the doctrinal content of the Catholic Faith in demonstrable action. It was only in the 16^{th} century where the bifurcation or division between works and faith became so vehement and faith was reduced to either an individual response or to an intense emotional feeling of trust. Faith in the apostolic mindset is something that illumines the mind and heart and is the virtue whereby we are able to freely assent to what God has revealed. We receive this Godgiven virtue or power by our baptism. It inheres in intellect, or the part of the soul that reasons ideas or concepts which is unique to human beings. Because we are not only thinking but doing creatures and the fact that God became man and took on human flesh and demonstrably showed forth His Divinity and sacred humanity in various miracles and other visible and palpable action, we too are called to live the virtue of Faith in daily action in time. For us, Faith is not an ethereal ideal which is unreachable, but a gift from God that is shown by our living it. We comport ourselves a certain way, we live by a moral code given to us by God for our salvation, we treat our neighbor as Christ Himself. The way we live our faith and the virtue of faith itself is not based on a divorce, but on a happy and integral marriage. Just as we confess our sins and failings in thought, word and deed, we should think with the mind of Christ, speak with the lips of Christ, and live through our actions with hands of Christ.
