Thoughts from The Pastor

PRESUPPOSITION

At the beginning of his Spiritual Exercises, St. Ignatius offers two little ‘pre-meditations’, that he asks us to take into account due to their importance for Christian life. The first is the ‘Presupposition’, the latter is the ‘Principle and Foundation’.

The ‘**Presupposition**’ follows thus: **In order that both he who is giving the Spiritual Exercises, and he who is receiving them, may more help and benefit themselves, let it be presupposed that every good Christian is to be more ready to save his neighbor’s proposition than to condemn it.**

The enemy of mankind – Satan – is accustomed to work us over on different levels. Temptation can come from the exterior, but thoughts and fancies play out on the interior, and are arguably more dangerous. Yet even deeper are those ideas and words that he suggests to make us doubt. The serpent began to tempt Eve by suggesting an idea to her mind: what if that God who has given you everything, has told you a falsehood? No, you will not die if you eat the fruit!

Satan will suggest falsehoods, half truths, truths tainted with lies and bitterness, to try and drag you under at any given turn. He will suggest them about your spouse, your friends, your children, parents, priests, coworkers... and at nearly every turn, about God. **You MUST at all times ‘be more ready to save your neighbor’s proposition [what he has expressed] than to condemn it.’**

St. Ignatius continues: **If he cannot save it [the proposition], let him inquire how he means it; and if he means it badly, let him correct him with charity.** This refers to a real misunderstanding or misinterpretation of the facts primarily those concerning our faith and how we live it. COMMUNICATION is key to overcoming the suggestions and falsehoods of the enemy.

If that is not enough, continues St. Ignatius, **let him seek all the suitable means to bring him to mean it well, and save himself.** If someone cannot be reached... if someone is isolating, or stubborn to your approach, then you cannot remain distant. Charity calls you to reach out to them in a language they understand. Speak to them with diplomacy, with gentleness, showing them why it’s in their interests to open their hearts up. People need time, they need respect, and above all they need love. Rarely will they resist your charity if you can give them those things – that is, at the very least, the Christian presupposition.
