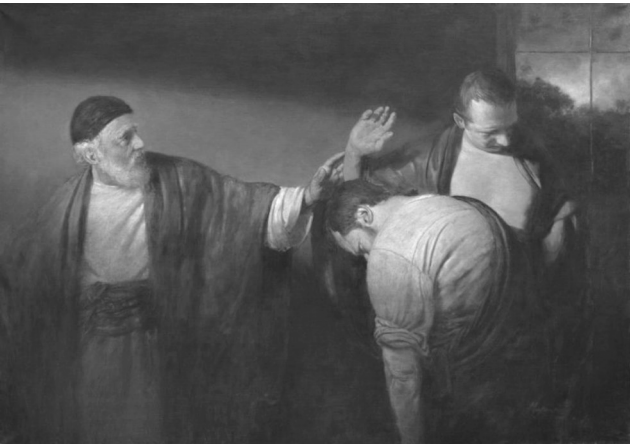

Thoughts from The Pastor

PRINCIPLE AND FOUNDATION

Principle and foundation of the interior life, according to St. Ignatius, is a profound text that has inspired Saints such as St. Francis Xavier and St. Peter Claver to a tremendous generosity. It starts out saying:

Man is created to praise, reverence, and serve God our Lord, and by this means to save his soul. And the other things on the face of the earth are created for man, that they may help him to reach the end for which he is created.

Man is created to: We are created TO, meaning, to do something. Life has a meaning – we all know that. But have you ever thought that your life has a specific meaning, a purpose, a mission, unique to you? Your virtues, your love, your choices, are unique and irrepetible. If you choose to love God, it will bring Him joy that nobody else could give Him. And if you choose not to love Him, nobody will love Him in your place.

To praise, reverence, and serve God... – every breath that I draw, every thought, every word, is called to become, praise, adoration, and service to God. We might not be able to focus on prayer all day long, but when our actions and words are informed by love of God, and we raise our mind and heart to Him frequently, we can achieve the same fruits as if we were. And in our daily interactions, what do we see? Nihilism, hedonism, and indifferentism. And we are irreversibly opposed to them: every moment of our lives has a purpose. I am made for God, and my task in life is to correspond to Him.

...And by this means, to save his soul: because there is no guarantee we will reach eternal salvation, unless we strive to reach it, without daring to presume we have already secured it. We must work out our salvation in fear and trembling; for this reason, St. Augustine says what you are doing is not enough: ‘No! Do not say it is enough! Once you say that it is enough, it is not enough’. Your temporal choices have eternal consequences. This thought should take away any peace and tranquillity that we have in ourselves: our only peace is in God. ‘In your will is our peace, Lord’ (St. Francis of Assisi)
